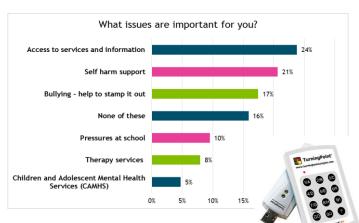
Youth Conference February 2015

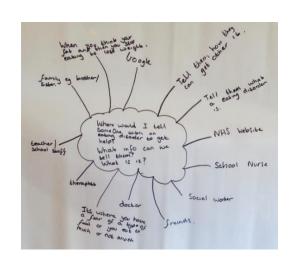






Eating Disorders Project

- Lack of support and information for young people on the subject of eating disorders
- Young Healthwatch developed the survey during the Eating Disorders Workshop
- Young Healthwatch received over 2000 responses from young people all over Northamptonshire and schools - 5 times as many as forecast
- LGBTQ focus group @ The Lowdown







SEND Project

- Unplanned piece of work
- SENDsation Day Sept 2015 and IASS Conference March 2016
- Views are often overlooked with parents taking over, we tried a new approach to see what kids really think
- 230 CYP contributed through events, assemblies and PHSE lessons (9 special schools)
 - Majority of respondents (85%) happy with their health and health services
 - The biggest concerns were regarding weight issues
 - 56% of respondents have been bullied (esp. girls)
 - 22% self harm
