So far we have seen how good symptom control requires an understanding of the cause of the symptom and an understanding of the different options available to treat each symptom.

We have seen that symptoms often respond to measures other than medication. We have also seen that if medications are needed, then they need to be given in a timely fashion to minimise distress.


We will now look at 'just in case' or anticipatory prescribing, which is an important strategy for helping patients get timely access to medications.
