BACKGROUND



Children were informed of their parents illness in a four bedded bay with only a curtain for privacy. The trust knew this was unacceptable

There was a growing need for a dedicated space for health care professionals to break significant news within a trusted and safe environment



CQC report highlighted concern that there was no private space to hold difficult conversations Comments where received from staff, patient and families that there was no privacy when receiving significant news



METHOD

Communication with local hospice, national child bereavement charities how to implement bereavement tools and how to improve support.

Discussed concerns with staff, patients and relatives the impact of lack of private space when receiving significant news.

Discussion with both trust and charity board to gain support , promote importance of project



Memory boxes , books, tears and stars where promoted throughout the hospital trust

RESULTS AND LOOKING FOWARD

Our completion of memory boxes, books and workbook have increased by 50 per cent since opening of Dennis Den



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Families can now skype to be involved in family occasions
