## Background

The Maternity Unit delivers in excess of 4,700 births each year and offers choice of birth including homebirth, birth in an onsite Birth Centre and an **Obstetric Birthing Suite.** 

### CHOICES

#### Not all women 'fit the criteria'

#### Their choice is not always our choice.

A plan is developed and shared with the MDT We act as advocates ensuring that the women and their families are at the centre of the care.

### **CONCERNS/COMPLAINTS**

We listen We apologise We validate We speak with staff and feedback We make meaningful changes Significant reduction in complaints

### CLOSURE

- Around 6% of women are diagnosed with traumatic stress after birth
- A further 20–25% go undiagnosed

# What do we do?

- Listen
- Show interest
- Care
- Apologise
- Validate
- Advocate
- Follow up
- Implement change



- Women can self refer or be referred
- PALS/Complaints office
- All day clinic -45 min appointments
- Home visits
- Return-no time limit

Staff, including students, are encouraged to sit in on the clinic. There is value in staff hearing the women's experiences, and our responses. We encourage transparency and aim to empower staff to put the women and

their families at the heart of the care.
