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# What is ECT?



- Leicestershire Partnership NHS Trust
- Electroconvulsive therapy (ECT), is a treatment for severe depression
- Small dose of electric current is used to induce seizures
- Used for >75 years

#### ECT – a controversial treatment



One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest

- Treatment considered barbaric
- Memory problems
- Half of the patients treated lack capacity to consent
- Media shows an out dated view of the process

## Mental illness is very disabling



- 1 in 4 suffer from mental health problems
- 3 in 100 will experience depression every year
- 4756 suicides in 2015
- Majority had depression

# ECT – a life saving treatment?



Patients are carefully chosen under the following categories:

- Severe depression
  - High suicide risk
  - Not eating or drinking
- Catatonia
- Severe mania

# ECT is not barbaric



- Given under general anaesthesia
- Use sophisticated machine
- Setting right dose
- EEG monitoring
- Less memory with unilateral treatment
