Why should this project win?

Innovative it is the 1st of its kind - 21st Century approach which can be replicated

A unique information source which is available to all, enables navigation through hospital services, departments and people – demystifies the hospital experience in a format that is now becoming familiar to Children and Young People (CYP) **Patient led -** created and shaped by CYP who create the content that they know is useful for themselves and their peers. Remains current - constantly evolving to meet the needs of CYP and the wider community

Results

Users: Hits: 12k views in 10 months. Currently used by CYP in Leeds Teaching Hospitals Trust (LTHT) as well as with adults with learning disabilities; it is a visual tool, therefore accessible to the diverse group of CYP e.g. a film using sign language **Additional benefits:** Therapeutic effects of sharing their experiences through film by creating a safe space for them to express their emotions. **Feedback:** is monitored, timely and acted upon speedily. Any concerns about the CYP's safety including safeguarding is addressed using standard procedures. All feedback about any aspect of their care is considered and used to improve services.
