- The idea came about after a visit to a neighbouring Trust
- Partnered with The Friends of St Peter's Hospital and local garden designer
- Patients, staff and families were consulted and involved
- Recognised the value of non-clinical spaces for patients and loved ones
- The presence of nature and landscapes in healthcare settings is known to aid recovery and reduce length of stay:
 - Tranquil space away from the noise and distractions on a ward
 - Dedicated space for end of life patients
 - Place for NICU families who've lost a baby to meet and grieve

- Lots of positive feedback left by each visitor in the guest book
- Some patients have talked to staff about how the space has benefited them at often very difficult times
- The creation of this garden has resulted in the proposal for another outdoor space to be created, to be called the COVID Staff Memorial Garden
- Commitment to improve hospital courtyard spaces at both Ashford

and St Peter's
