

Common Ambition Bristol (CAB) is a major 3- year community powered project led by <u>Brigstowe</u>. We work with African and Caribbean heritage communities in Bristol to reduce HIV diagnosis, stigma and generally improve sexual health.

This is a huge co-production project which includes health care professionals from Unity Sexual Health and the public health team from <u>Brital City Council</u> to introduce new ways to improve HV testing and troader sexual health services, as well as researchers from the <u>University of Bristol</u> working in collaboration with community members to evaluate the project.

African Voices Forum are the main community organisation partner on the project. The most important of all of our partners is of course the African and Caribbean heritage communities that we are working with.


