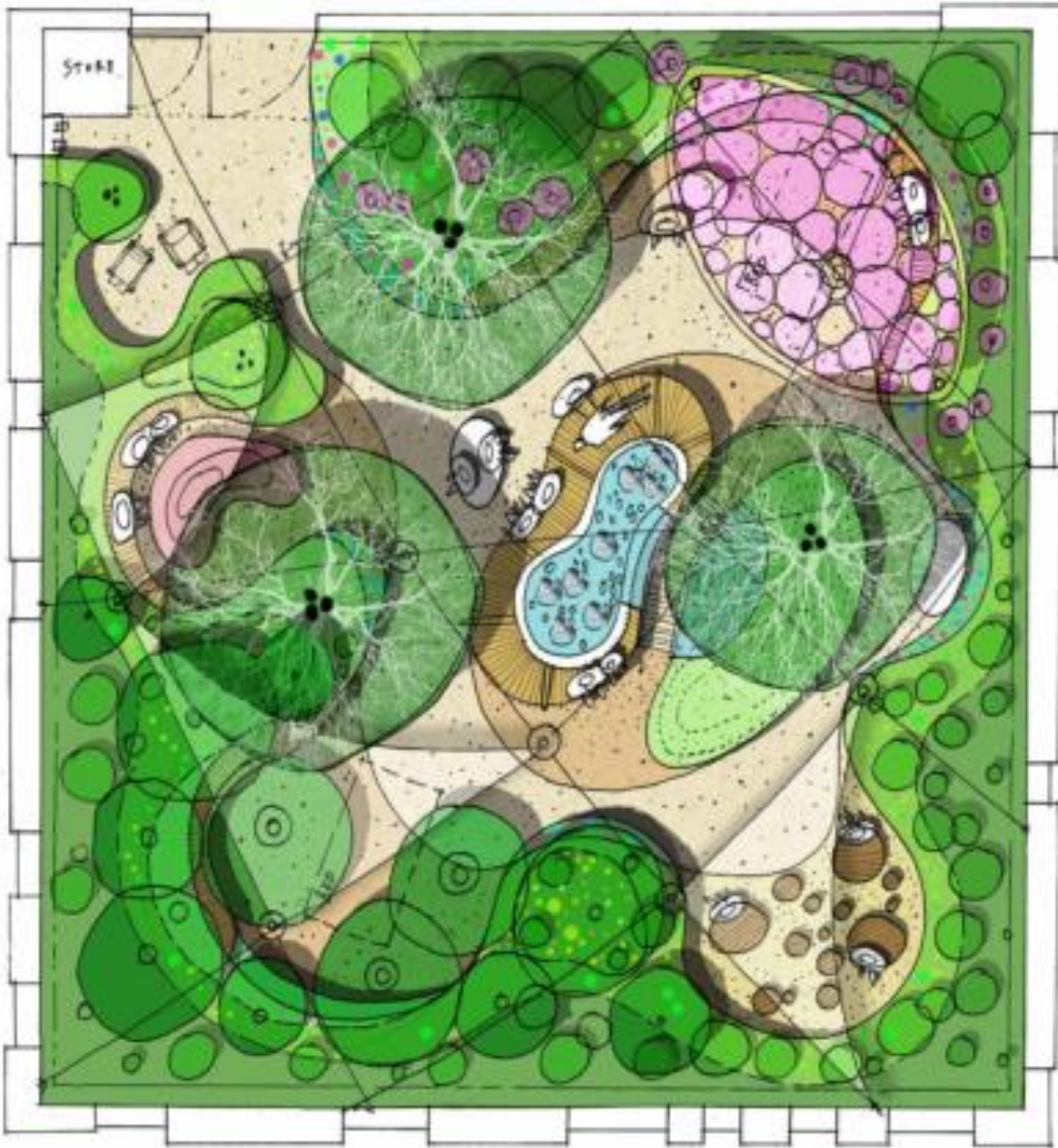

Time Line

- 27/11/2019 First contact with estates department
- Feb 2020 Agreement in principle to develop a garden space
- Feb 2020 Fundraising started
- 3/8/2020 Courtyard suggested but not confirmed
- 10/8/2020 current total £75,000
- 7/1/2021 current total £107,540
- 14/1/2021 Courtyard confirmed
- 15/2/2021 Agreement to allow medical gas supply
- 9/6/2021 Former BBC cameraman, Peter Champress agrees to film the garden's progress
- 27/7/2021 Lavigne Lonsdale commissioned to design garden
- 14/9/21 Initial Staff and patient consultation with Lavigne Lonsdale

5/3/2022 Stakeholder meeting to present garden design
