

Making it a better PLACE...

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What is PLACE?

PLACE stands for Patient Led Assessment of the Care Environment.

PLACE allows patients and the public to have a much stronger voice to identify what is important.

PLACE focuses on improvement with hospitals required to report publicly and say how they plan to improve where necessary.

PLACE is not a patient survey so respect the patient's privacy and take care to not interfere with the work of the hospital.



Why is PLACE important?

PLACE assesses a number of non-clinical aspects of the healthcare premises identified as important by patients and the public, known as domains:

- Cleanliness
- Food and hydration
- Privacy, dignity and wellbeing (It is not an assessment of staff practice)
- Condition, appearance and maintenance
- Dementia: how well the needs of patients with dementia are met
- Disability: how well the needs of patients with a disability are met



What makes UHCW different when undertaking PLACE?

- ➤ PLACE assessments are usually led by the Estates Team, but here at UHCW NHS Trust they are led by the Patient Insight and Involvement Team alongside the Estates Team.
- Unique approach really has improved how these assessments are run and actioned and ensures the patient voice is central in the assessments.
- More members of the public from many walks of life take part in the assessments as assessors.
- A dedicated PLACE Delivery Group has also been set up.

- Adaptive cutlery
- Stocked beverage trolleys
