Background to our project




H.O.P.E. is a 2-year project Funded through the Post-COVID recovery grant.

Partnership between the Royal Wolverhampton NHS Trust and the Wolverhampton Voluntary Community Action and is supported by NHS Charities Together and the Trust Charity

Formerly Wolverhampton Voluntary Sector Council

- We have an established Voluntary Service within RWT with infrastructure for recruiting, training and supporting RWT volunteers, which has been in operational since 2007. At our highest number, we have had in excess of 400 active volunteers registered.
- Volunteers managed by a small team, enhance existing Social Prescribing service across the city, targeting individuals and communities affected by the long term effects of Covid-19 and resulting Health Inequalities, in terms of addressing **physical health**, mental health and wellbeing, and reducing isolation and loneliness, which we hope may in turn relieve some pressures on frontline NHS services.
