Background – why we started

- •Important to *hear* and *listen* to young people about their experiences *and* their ideas.
- •To bring fresh, honest, and creative perspectives we see things you might not.
- Because shaping the future of care means involving its future users and workforce.







How we started – ideas into action

Launch event with young people & carers (October 2024 – 1 year old)

Creative and engaging tools: Mad-Glad-Sad, worry bucket, wish tree, create a name, design a logo

6 sessions since then themed around *fun* and *impact*

- **Festive season**: co-designing our 'Recipe for Success' & Priority Bingo
- Vision planning YPPC vision, webpage planning, uniform, Spond
 Dragons' Den: staff pitch for YPPC involvement
- **The Apprentice** pitched ideas to Sarah Brampton (Chief Finance Operator)
- **Summer fete** murals update, transitions, suicide prevention for young people
- Back to school recruitment panel, young peoples survey results, PLACE assessments

Designed with young people, for young people – Youth Led



What's worked well

- Organic, co-production optional
- •Youth-led identity: own logo,

badges, lanyards

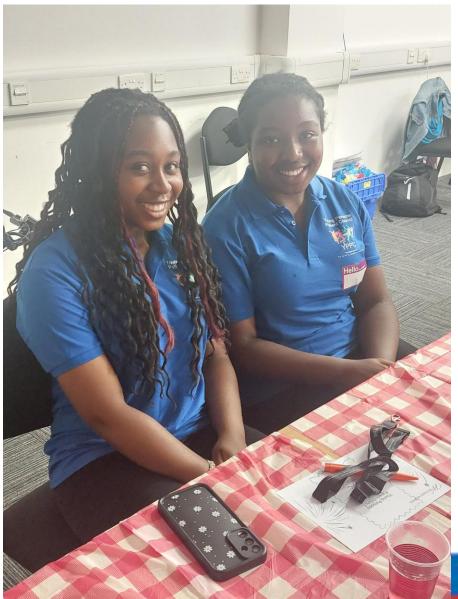
Flipping the power: exploring what matters most to us, not being done to

- Parents stepped back as confidence grew
- •Consistent format + flexible attendance = continued engagement
- •Financial support from Women's and Children's this has been vital
- Change in location
- Reaching out to seldom asked groups
- •Trusting relationships with staff who go above and beyond







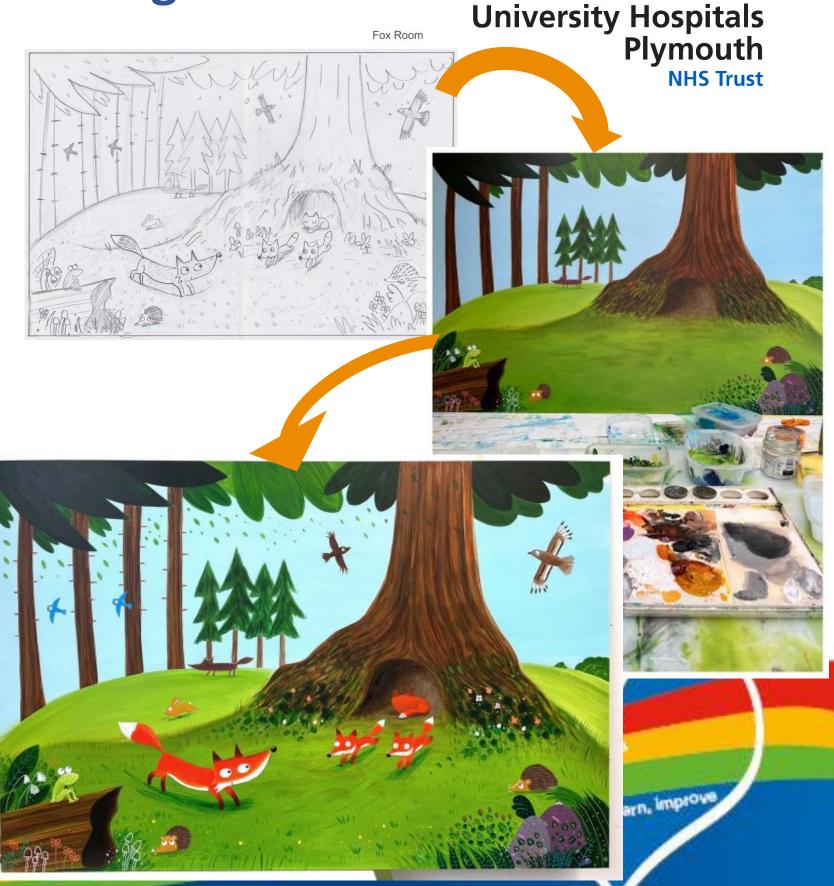


Take ownership

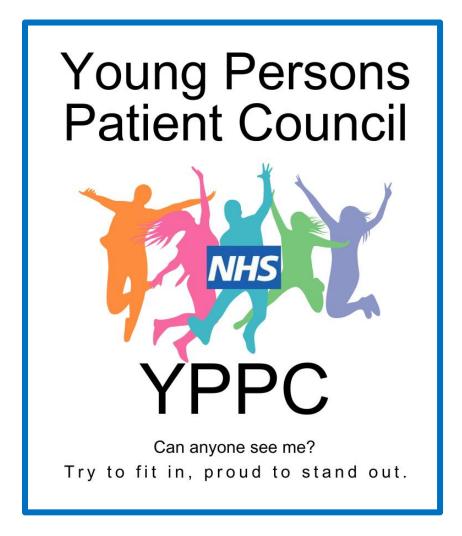




The difference we're making
